According to Ryan, 1997 "the majority of distance education today takes place using the Internet, now readily accessible for the vast majority of students whether in their own homes or at facilities such as local libraries". Distance learning can be with television, DVD, teleconferencing without forgetting the Internet. Also we can define it as teaching and learning demanding application of many technological request. This kind of education must be flexible and fair.

This type of teaching based on providing learners courses without being physically present at classroom. (Miller, 1993, p. 68) added:" a process to create and provide access to learning when the source of information and the learners are separated by time and distance, both" The university of London was the first to offer distance education degrees in 1858, this means that this field is not new. It has a historical evolution through time.

This study shows some advantages and disadvantages of distance teaching. Also it contains some suggestions and recommendations for teacher's performance in the future occasions. In order to do so some questions are raised in the very beginning of this research.

- Does distance learning cover learner's needs? Are learners satisfied during learning using this type of education?
- What can we suggest for teachers to enhance teaching and make it successful?

This research first contains definitions and historical notions, study's findings and recommendations and suggestions.

1. Distance learning:

Distance learning means:"a way of studying in which you do not attend a school college, or university but study from where you live, usually being taught and given work to do over the internet: They offer advanced degrees or professional certification through distance

Technology has been widely developed, that's why everything has changed. For instance, learning is no longer related to school and university, students can learn without being physically at classroom.

(Casarotti, 2002, p. 37): "The basic definition of distance learning considers that the teacher and the students are separate in the spatial dimension and that this distance is filled by using technological resources"

Websters and Hackley defined it as a kind of teaching which involves the executing data, calculating and transmissions technology applications in many places.

2. History of distance learning:

In spite of the lately technological evolution, distance education was utilized since more than one century ago. But they do not use modern automation for learning.

Researches shows that this kind of education is not new. For the first time it has been appeared in London in 1858, they used to offer distance learning degrees. After that in 1892 exactly in the USA William Rainey Harper developed the concept of extended education and encouraged correspondence school courses to further promote education at Columbia University.

Distance learning course utilized first and second age transmission technologies. The first generation (1850s to 1960) consisted of printing radio and television. The second one (1960-1985) distance learning courses used multiple technologies without automations like audiocassettes, television, fax and print..etc. After that era teachers use mixed-media approach to enrich distance education technologies by sending e-mails in the form of texts, audio-visuals, broadcast radio and television to learners.

3. Distance learning's theories:

Garrison(1985), and Aydemir, Ozkeskin, and Akkurt (2015) classified technological evolution of previous and distance education under three generations: Writing, meeting, computer. In the other hand Anderson and Dron (2011) classed them as: Mass media, conferencing, and networking.

Another researchers called Gunawardena and McIsaac (2003) saw that it's not fair to equal audio-video and data system to integrated telecommunication systems.

"Aderson considered a number of theories and models but focused on the well-respected work of Bransford Brown, and coking(1999) who posited that effective learning

environments are framed within the convergence of four overlapping lenses: community-centeredness, knowledge-centeredness, and assessment-centeredness. These lenses provides the foundation framework for Anderson's approach to building online education theory, as he examined in detail the characteristics and facilities that the Internet provides with regards to each of the four lenses. Second, he noted that the Internet had evolved from a text-based environment to one in which all forms of media are supported and readily available. He also accurately commented that the Internet's hyperlink capacity is most compatible with the way human knowledge is stored and accessed". In this regard he referred to the extensively examined the importance of interaction in all forms of learning and referred to a mostly distance education theorists such as (Holmberg, 1989), Moore and Kearsley (1996), and Garrison and Shale (1990)."The essence of interaction among students, teachers, and content is well understood and is referenced in many theories of education, especially constructivism (Piccia, 2017)".

It was shown that facebook helps in achieving academic success. In addition to that autonomy can do an effective role for enhancing self-education." (Zimmerman, p. 202) explains that learner autonomy or learner independence is a major contribution to success in e-learning environments in which learners are responsible for their own learning". Also Lynch and Dembo (2004) considered that autonomy is a major element in successful online distance learning.

Schema about learning and the online Environment:




Figure 1. Theories of learning and the Online Environment

Complicated technology:

Learners needs to invest in arrange of equipment including computer, webcam, and stable internet connection. In case of any software or hardware malfunction, the class session will come to a standstill, something that can interrupt the learning process. Moreover, the complicated nature of the technology used in distance learning only limits online education to students who are computer and tech savvy.

Job markets do not accept online degrees:

Learner might get a degree but that is not going to be recognized by private companies in the job market and the same problem in government jobs.

No direct social contact:

Students frequently study alone and thus feel isolated and lack the physical social interaction that comes with attending a regular class. Working alone in the early hours leads to many complexities and depressing situations.

Difficulty staying in touch with teachers:

If students have issues with assignments or questions about a traditional course, it is generally fairly easy to talk to the instructor before or after class or to schedule meetings online at another time.

Complex technology:

Learners must invest in equipment such as a computer, a webcam and a stable Internet connection. If the software or hardware malfunctions, the class session will shut down, which can stop the teaching progress. Furthermore, the complicated nature of the technology involved in distance learning restricts online learning to students who are computer and technology literate.

Labour markets do not support online diplomas:

The student may get a diploma, but it will not be accepted by private firms in the labour market, and the same issue arises for public jobs.

3. Method of research:




Figure 1. Using online media to share courses






Figure 5.learner's barrier
